

Sharing your story: Tips for writing testimony.

Your testimony should be your story, in your words. Do you support or oppose the bill? Why are you testifying? What makes this bill important to you? What do legislators need to know about you, your family, and the impact of a bill to help them support your position?

You can submit testimony in person or in writing. Each committee will post their own directions and email address for submitting testimony. If you are testifying in person you must keep your remarks to three (3) minutes.

SAMPLE TESTIMONY TEMPLATE:

Dear Honorable Members of the Legislative Committee,
